

IRWIN PROJECTOR:

HOW TO OPERATE:

1. Make **sure** batteries are placed so that front one has points down and back one with point facing upward. (See Fig. 1)
 2. Be **sure** that bulb is firmly placed in socket. Then place fiber piece under lip inside case and push protruding fiber tab down as far as it will go. It will then snap and stay down and bulb will stay lit. (See Fig. 2) To turn off light pull tab up.
 3. Slip film under flat nicked metal plate, with objects on film **upside down** to the Eye, so that loop is formed **alongside of projector**. Place film holes **even with guide lines on flat nicked metal plate before turning crank** so that prongs will enter the holes and not injure the film. Be sure cover is on. (Fig. 3)
 4. "If necessary to square picture, turn bulb slightly."
- (A) MACHINE WORKS BEST WHEN FASTENED DOWN OR HELD ON TABLE ABOUT THREE FT. FROM SCREEN. A LARGER OR SMALLER PICTURE IS SHOWN BY MOVING PROJECTOR FURTHER OR NEARER TO SCREEN.
- (B) DON'T FAIL TO PUT **FILM HOLES EVEN WITH LINES ON FLAT METAL PLATE BEFORE TURNING CRANK OR YOU WILL TEAR FILM.**
- (C) **THIS PROJECTOR OR EVEN A HUNDRED DOLLAR PROJECTOR WILL NOT MAKE A CLEAR PICTURE UNLESS USED IN A VERY DARK PLACE.**

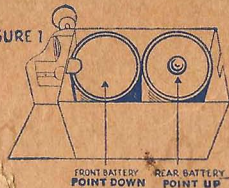
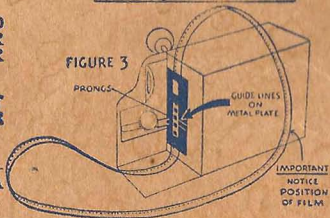
