



INSTRUCTIONS FOR REFILLING

(1) Turn your movie-machine down-side up so that you can see the four books fitted into the grooves of the central reel. Take the old books out carefully and keep them.

(2) Insert four of your new books into the four grooves. You do this by holding the lens toward you and inserting the books with the subject away from you, otherwise the picture will run backwards. Now holding the movie-machine firmly, insert the front edge of the back of the book into the groove, pressing the book firmly against the SIDE of the groove toward you. Still pressing firmly and down, then the upper side of the back of the book will slip into its place and lower edge will fit into a groove which will hold it firmly. Make sure books are in center of grooves.

(3) If, however, the books seem to be loose, simply press the sides of the grooves toward each other until they clamp the book fast.

This box of eight books together with the four you have just taken out give you twelve "movies," and by mixing them up you can have many changes. Some children will be interested to write a little story about what they think of each character and what he is doing. Twelve little stories will make, altogether, a little BOOK OF YOUR VERY OWN about your own movie stars! ! !

We sincerely hope that you will have as much fun with your new "movies" as we have had in preparing them for you.

HOW TO MAKE COLORED MOVIES

Get a set of colored crayons (red, yellow, light blue, dark blue, or possibly green). These colors will be sufficient to enable one to make attractive color combinations.

Color one page at a time and be SURE to repeat exactly the same colors in each picture. That is, if you start with a green elephant, a yellow stool and a red floor, you MUST repeat the same colors throughout.

This making colored movies is lots of fun and helps children to appreciate color and helps to teach them to paint.
